The EMEPA system is like no other in the United States. We actually operate two rural electric distribution systems. Both are not-for-profit, consumerowned cooperatives. They are operated and governed by the same employees, management, directors and bylaws.

By an act of the U.S. Congress, our service area north of the Kemper/
Lauderdale county line is served with
Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) power
(Winston, Kemper, Attala, Neshoba and
Noxubee counties). The service area
south of this line is served with power

purchased from Mississippi Power Company and Southeastern Power Administration (Lauderdale, Clarke, Jasper, Newton and Wayne counties).

TVA is an unsubsidized corporation of the U.S. Government and operates under regulations and policies somewhat differently from private power companies. In some instances, this requires the north and south systems to operate under different practices and procedures. But remember, in either system you are a full-fledged voting member-owner of EMEPA.
